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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of Qualitek Labs Limited Report on audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **Qualitek Labs Limited** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023, the Statement of Profit and Loss, Statement of Cash Flow, Statement of Equity for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "Financial Statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the company as at March 31, 2023, its profit, cash flows and its change in equity for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial information in accordance with the Standards on Auditing ("SA") specified under section 143 (10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report.



We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (the "ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act, and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the financial statements.

Emphasis of Matter

Without qualifying our opinion, attention is invited to following matter as described below:

As per Section 16 of MSMED Act provides, if payment is not made within the time limit specified under section 15, then the interest payable shall be three times of the bank rate notified by the RBI. However, Referring to Note No. 32 "Disclosure related to MSMEs", During the year, Company recognize interest on dues only for those MSME parties with whom transactions took place during the year or dues are outstanding at the end of the year. To the extent of interest not booked, the profit of the company is overstated. In the absence of information provided by management, we are unable to quantify such overstatement.

Our Opinion is not modified in respect of the matter mentioned in above paragraph.

Responsibility of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statement

The Company's Management and Board of Directors are responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Act, with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the Company, Statement of Equity and cash flows of the company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.



In preparing the financial statements, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under section 143(3)(i) of the Companies Act, 2013, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the company has adequate internal financial controls system in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management & Board of Director's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are



based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

• Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in audit of the financial statements of current period and are therefore the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditors report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extreme rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Report On other Legal & Regulatory Requirements

As required by the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order 2020 ("the Order"), issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub section (11) of section 143 of the Act and on the basis of such checks of the books and records of the company, as we considered appropriate and according to the information & explanation given to us, we give in the **Annexure "A"**, a statement on the matters specified in Paragraph 3 and 4 of the order, to the extent applicable.

As required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, we report that:

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit.
- b) Proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as it appears from our examination of those books.
- c) The Balance Sheet, the Statement of Profit and Loss, statement of equity and the Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account.

1 Company overview

Qualitek Labs Limited (Formerly Qualitek Labs Private Limited / "the Company"), is incorporated in India as a public limited company under the Companies Act, 2013. The Company is engaged in the business of providing Testing, Inspection and Certification services in the fields of Automobiles, Electronics & Electricals, Pharmaceuticals, Environment, Food, Water, Minerals etc. The Company operates state-of-the-art laboratories which are accredited with NABL and other accreditation bodies in India.

2 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014 (as amended). The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention on accrual basis. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Company.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non current, wherever applicable as per the operating cycle of the Company as per the guidance as set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013.

2.1 Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting policies requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements. The estimates and assumptions used are based on management evaluation of relevant facts and circumstances as on the date of financial statements. Actual results if they differ from those estimates are recognised prospectively in the current and future periods. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in the current and future periods.

2.2 Significant accounting policies

A. Revenue recognition

(i) Sale of services:

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured. The primary source of revenue of the Company is from providing Testing, Inspection and Certification services. Revenue from rendering of services is recognized on accrual basis in accordance with the terms if underlying agreement. Revenue from time and material contracts is recognised as and when the Company renders the service. Company follows completed service contract method for recognising revenue as per AS 9.

(ii) Interest and Other income:

Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis at the applicable rates.

B. Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impainment losses (if any). Cost comprises the purchase price and any costs of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. When an asset is scrapped or otherwise disposed off, the cost and related accumulated depreciation are removed from the books of account and resultant profit or loss, (if any), is reflected in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Fixed assets under construction and cost of assets not ready for use before the end of financial year are disclosed as capital work-in-progress.

C. Intangible assets

Intangible assets comprise of computer software are stated at cost less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses (if any).

D. Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciable amount for assets is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its estimated residual value. Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided on Straight line method as per the rates prescribed under Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

E. Impairment of assets

The Company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognised in the statement of profit and loss. If at the balance sheet date there is an indication that a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists then the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciated historical cost and the same is accordingly reversed in the statement of profit and loss.

F. Lease/Rent Expense

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating lease are recognised as an expense in the statement of profit and loss on a straight-line method over the lease term.

G. Employee benefits

Expenses and liabilities in respect of employee benefits are recorded in accordance with Revised Accounting Standard 15 - Employee Benefits.

(i) Provident fund

The Company makes contribution to statutory provident fund in accordance with Employees Provident Fund and (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1952. The plan is a defined contribution plan and contribution paid or payable is recognised as an expense in the period in which services are rendered by the employee.

(ii) Gratuity

Gratuity liability is defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of financial year.

(iii) Other short-term benefits

Compensated absences are recognized as expense in the period to which they pertain, as the same are short term in nature. Expenses in respect of other short-term benefits, if any, are recognized on the basis of the amount paid or payable for the period during which services are rendered by the employee.

H. Investments

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long-term investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognice a decline other than temporary in the value of the long term investments.

I. Taxes on income

Tax expenses comprises of current tax and deferred tax.

(i) Current tax

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the applicable tax rates and the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and other applicable tax laws.

(ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax reflects the impact of current period timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the period and reversal of timing differences of earlier years. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised. Deferred tax asset to the extent it pertains to unabsorbed business loss/ depreciation is recognised only to the extent that there is virtual certainty of realisation based on convincing evidence, as evaluated on a case to case basis.



J. Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the closing number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the period as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the closing number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the closing number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

K. Foreign currency transactions

(i) Initial recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

(ii) Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing rate. Non-monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction; and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rates that existed when the values were determined.

(iii) Exchange differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items of on reporting company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in the previous financial statements, are recognised as income or expense in the year in which they arise.

L. Contingent liabilities and provisions

The Company makes a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event where the outflow of economic resources is probable and a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation can be made.

A disclosure is made for a contingent liability when there is a:

- i) possible obligation, the existence of which will be confirmed by the occurrence/non-occurrence of one or more uncertain events, not fully with in the control of the Company; or
- ii) present obligation, where it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; or
- ill) present obligation, where a reliable estimate cannot be made.

When there is a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is

M. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash at bank, cash in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less which are highly liquid and readily convertible to known amounts of cash.

N. Borrowing Costs

Borrowing Costs are defined as interest and other costs related to borrowing of funds. Borrowing costs which are directly attributable to acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets are capitalised as per AS16 - Borrowing Costs. An asset which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use or sale is called qualifying asset.
